 $\frac{\text{Colossians 3: }12 \text{ - }17\text{:}}{^{12}\text{Put on then, as God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, compassion, kindness, lowliness,}}$ meekness, and patience, <sup>13</sup> forbearing one another and, if one has a complaint against another, forgiving each other; as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must forgive. 14 And above all these put on love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony. <sup>15</sup> And let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in the one body.
